VOCABULARY: Seder: Literally meaning order, this is the special ritual meal for the first night (or 2, depending on how you celebrate) of Passover. There are 15 traditional “parts” of the seder, all of which help us tell AND experience the story of Passover. Haggadah: Meaning “telling,” the Haggadah is the book that is used during the seder meal.
